

Choosing the Right Glove

There are lots of different types of gloves used in our industry. Make sure you have the right glove for the job:



Kevlar gloves are cut resistant and long-wearing. They offer hand protection when sorting ferrous and nonferrous metals with sharp or jagged edges.



Puncture-resistant gloves are good for applications when needle sticks or punctures must be prevented.



Double-palm leather gloves provide good protection, long wear, and good grip and handling features for heavy ferrous sorting and picking.



Kevlar sleeves help prevent cuts on forearms when reaching across shaker tables or into Gaylord boxes.



Rubber-coated gloves help keep the hands dry during wet weather or while sorting oily scrap.
