A man was killed in an industrial accident this morning. Authorities said the 55-year old worker was crushed by a piece of equipment while working at a scrap metal recycling center. He was pronounced dead at the scene by an EMS. The Sheriff's Office said he was working on a skid steer loader when hydraulic lines lost pressure causing the bucket to fall, pinning him underneath. He was reportedly a longtime employee of the company. The accident remains under investigation by the Sheriff's Office and OSHA.
